Selections were made on the basis of the qualifying tests, recommendations, citizenship records, leadership abilities, extra-curricular activities and high school grades.

The scholarships range from \$250 to \$1500 yearly for each winner who attends college. The total amount of each scholarship is determined by the student's need for financial assistance.

This year the Fund is awarding \$119, 600 in scholarships to 150 high school seniors in 19 states. These scholarships bring the Fund's total to 383 awarded since 1962, when the current program started. The Chrysler Fund scholarship program is the largest of its type in terms of number of scholarships it grants yearly.
