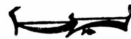

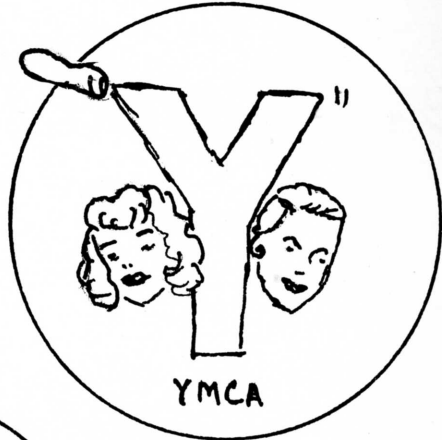

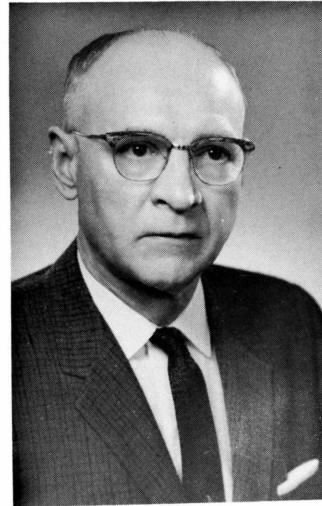
I hope you have a fine summer vacation and return to school in September full of energy and ready for another successful school year.

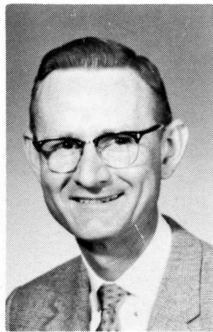

DEPARTMENTS

ENGLISH

During the three years of junior high English classes, the students have been helped by a functional language-arts program. The basic skills emphasized were reading, writing, speaking, listening, spelling and studying.

Classroom projects in writing included reports, letters, stories, autobiographies, essays and other compositions. In addition to the regular class work, many students entered spelling, poetry, vocabulary, grammar, essay and speech contests. Several students were responsible for publishing the school paper, "Junior Hi-Lights," and the yearbook, JUNIOR HIGH REVIEW, under the sponsorship of Mrs. Nead.

Mrs. Nead's speech classes have given daily announcements, weekly devotional and patriotic programs and convocations. One of Mrs. Poole's classes was responsible for announcements and programs in Building B.

Developmental reading was stressed for eighth and ninth grade English classes in the Reading Center with Mrs. Bilby. Speed and comprehension were increased as well as growth in vocabulary. English classes were taught by Mrs. Nead, Mrs. Rickert, Mr. M. Wallace, Mr. Neuman, Mrs. Hunter, Miss Throckmorton, Mrs. Poole, Mrs. VanBebber, Mrs. Williams, Mr. Yazel, Mrs. Ankrom and Mrs. Janulis, head of the English Department.

HOMEMAKING

Girls who took classes in homemaking learned much about the art of sewing and cooking. Classes in this department were offered to seventh and ninth grade girls. In the sewing classes girls enjoyed making pillow cases and aprons, constructing stuffed animals and designing skirts, blouses and shorts. Good grooming was studied. A style show was held in May.

In foods classes proper nutrition was studied. Students planned, prepared and served various meals.

The foods classes prepared several different foods for display in Building A. This consisted of Merry Christmas cookies, cut-up cakes, such as dogs, fish, snowmen and even a pink elephant.

A Christmas Tea was given by the first period class for the faculty.

Christmas stockings used for favors at the Clinic was another project undertaken by the sixth period class.

Homemaking proved to be fun and instructive as taught by Mrs. Francisco, Mrs. Razor, Mrs. Klipsch and Mrs. Reddish.

MATHEMATICS

The goal of instruction at the junior high level is to provide a learning program adapted into adolescence.

The primary objectives are: (1) to develop the ability to use mathematical processes with an insight into their value; (2) to provide experiences which will give the child the ability to apply his knowledge in the affairs of daily life.

Teachers of math are Mrs. Saint, Mr. Niflis, Miss Rupley, Mr. K. Wallace, Mr. Brooks, Mr. Bowers, Mr. Wanley, Mrs. Ankrom, Mr. Daggy, Mr. King, Mr. Pasman and Miss Smith, department head.

INDUSTRIAL ARTS

This course specializes in the study of the changes in the form of materials to make them more useful to man's needs. Taught by Mr. Locke in Building A, students learn correct use of tools, the careful selection and handling of materials and the constructive cooperation of working with others.

PRINTING

Ninth grade boys, under the supervision of Mr. Beguhn, are enabled to delve into the graphic arts (printing) and a few of the varied opportunities available to them.

Divided into four areas, this course includes block cutting, book binding, silk screen and hand composition.

Having this background material enables a student to elect to continue his work in the graphic arts—one area in a vast number of related fields. Further training is obtained in the vocational printing trades class, open to juniors and seniors.

HEALTH AND PERSONAL LIVING

Techniques of group guidance were used first semester to assist the individual to achieve better understanding of self and others, to plan for high school and to make vocational studies. Personality, interest and I.Q. tests were taken by the students.

Mental health, body systems and functions, nutrition, diseases, health services, safety and first aid, narcotics and alcohol were topics covered in the second semester. Self responsibility for following wholesome health practices received emphasis.

Teachers in this department are Mr. Judd, Mr. Marks and Mr. Taylor Morris.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Physical education has been taught to both boys and girls this year in the seventh and eighth grades.

These students have participated in many activities including tumbling, volleyball, basketball, square dancing, rhythms and kickball. Wrestling was included in the curriculum this year. Students not only developed healthier bodies, but learned the meaning of coordination in working together in teams, as well as individually.

Instructors were Miss Fleming and Mr. Wegesin.

MUSIC

School wouldn't be school without our music program, and this year courses in this field included band, orchestra and choir. Each group had participants entered in solo and ensemble competition, of which several were first place winners in the state contest.

Several eighth and ninth grade bandmen participated in the first band camp at McCormack's Creek Park for a week of marching, playing and recreation.

Mr. Gustin was choir director. Mrs. McConnell was a new addition to the staff. She taught "A" Orchestra and "B" Band, while Mr. Pressler taught "C" Band and "C" Orchestra. Miss Martin directed "A" Band and "B" Orchestra and, in addition, organized a small pep band. The string ensemble was also continued.

CRAFTS

Pupils in Mr. Albrecht's craft classes explore and make many projects from a wide variety of materials, such as metals, wood, reed, ceramics, mosaics and plaster.

Many decorative and useful objects are made while each pupil is encouraged to develop his own ideas and initiative in handwork.

HEALTH SERVICES

Efficient nurses in our junior high school are Mrs. Baily in Building A and Mrs. Klein in Building B. They administer immediate attention to sudden illnesses and accidents, and, if necessary, notify parents who call for the pupil. When parents cannot be located, the student is taken directly to the family physician or home as the need requires.

ART

Early in the year hearing tests are given to the seventh grade pupils by therapists F. Bahy and W. Hookey. They also give speech therapy to those needing help in all three grades.

All eighth grade pupils are given tuberculin tests as well as vision tests. If the tuberculin test is positive (which indicates the presence of the germ in the body), the student is scheduled for a chest X-ray. New students in any of the three grades take these tests also. All eighth grade and new ninth grade students are given health interviews.

Dr. Fisher, the school physician, performs health examinations, calling to the attention of the student's parents any problems which he locates. Through services of the family doctor the pupil secures prompt correction of the defect.

SCIENCE

Science students have delved into many areas this year including prehistoric life, electricity, uses for radioisotopes and the latest theory of tornado formation. The science teachers—Mr. Bookout, Mr. Williams, Mrs. Dudelston and Mr. King—have varied backgrounds in science and they are able to present a variety of topics to help prepare their students for the space age.

The Science Club, open to eighth and ninth grade scientists, has been very active. The club members have made one field trip each month to such places as Spring Mill and Clifty Falls State Parks, Holcomb Observatory and Indiana University. A camping trip to the Mary Gray Bird Sanctuary is planned for late spring.

GENERAL SHOP

The general shop is best characterized by the broad scope and variety of experiences it offers to junior high school boys taking industrial arts for the first time.

Being cognizant of the fact that the basic objective of industrial arts is to interpret industrial occupations and the products of industry, Mr. Giles and Mr. Jurney each spend one semester with each boy in the seventh grade. Because students have a natural desire to investigate, experiment and construct articles, this objective can be accomplished through the construction of useful projects involving pupil planning and individual and group activity.

Industrial arts is certainly a part of general education. It derives its content from industry—a basic element of our culture—and further, it has as its social purpose a greater understanding and better control of the phenomena of industry.

GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING

The guidance and counseling department serves every student from the time he enters the seventh grade until he leaves the junior high school to become a high school sophomore.

If a student needs help with personal problems, class adjustment or future plans, he visits the office of Mrs. Saint in the seventh grade, Mr. Lehr in the eighth grade or Miss Modlin in the ninth grade. With these counselors, each student individually plans his subjects for the following year. In preparation for high school, group meetings and individual conferences are arranged with the students and parents to present the entire high school course of study and to aid in the selection of the curriculum to be followed.

Mr. Corbin has charge of attendance in the seventh grade and sponsors the student council. In the eighth and ninth grades Mr. Lehr supervises attendance and with Miss Modlin co-sponsors student council.

Mrs. Dickerson's pupils have worked in various medias this year. All classes participated in the collage projects. One of the best was made by Jane Baughn. It was an engine with three box cars made of wooden match boxes and covered with paper. In the distance were telephone poles made of toothpicks; fleecy clouds of cotton hung overhead.

Vee Ann Flayler made a head of a kitten from fleecy cotton with button eyes. Jane Ford made a dog of tan and white shag cotton. The dog looks as though it could speak. Jane Baughn, Lana Bertram, James Meadows, Carol Burgess, Gary Owens and Jill Lough made exceptionally good paper mosaics. Jill's was a ballet dancer against a web.

The sixth and seventh period classes made posters for the American Legion Poppy Day. Winners will be announced Honor Day.

Pen and ink drawings were made. From eleven entries sent to the National Poetry Anthology Art Division, those drawn by Mike Winchester, Susan Jeffries and Cody Carnes were accepted.

Other class projects included water color, chalk drawing, linoleum block and potato printing. Art classes made charcoal drawings and soap carvings.

Connie Swoveland, Jill Lough and Lana Bertram decorated bulletin boards.

Mrs. Reddish supervised the JUNIOR HIGH REVIEW Cover Design Contest. The winner was Martha Matern. Virginia Dickerson won an honorable mention on her water color of a wheat field in the L. S. Ayres Scholastic Art Award Contest.

At Christmas time, art students were responsible for many outstanding bulletin boards and classroom decorations. Other projects were figure drawing, water color, collage and veneer pictures. Especially popular was a unit on commercial art.

LIBRARIES

Our libraries are ready to serve students and teachers with materials for the various departments in the curriculum as well as recreational reading and browsing.

It is in the library that students can and should learn how to use library facilities to enrich and supplement their class work and individual interests. Teacher librarians, Miss Quigley in Building B and Mrs. Scheetz in Building A, are always ready to help students learn to help themselves as they seek reference information or merely recreational reading.

Student helpers (known as Library Cadets in Building A) come from their study halls to help with many routine duties such as checking out books, shelving returned materials, re-enforcing magazines, decorating bulletin boards, filing, etc. Their own work comes before any of these duties, but they all manage to help some each hour. Our professionally-trained librarians are continually selecting materials to meet the needs of our industrial program and to provide an opportunity for additional exploration and discovery for individuals, both teacher and students.

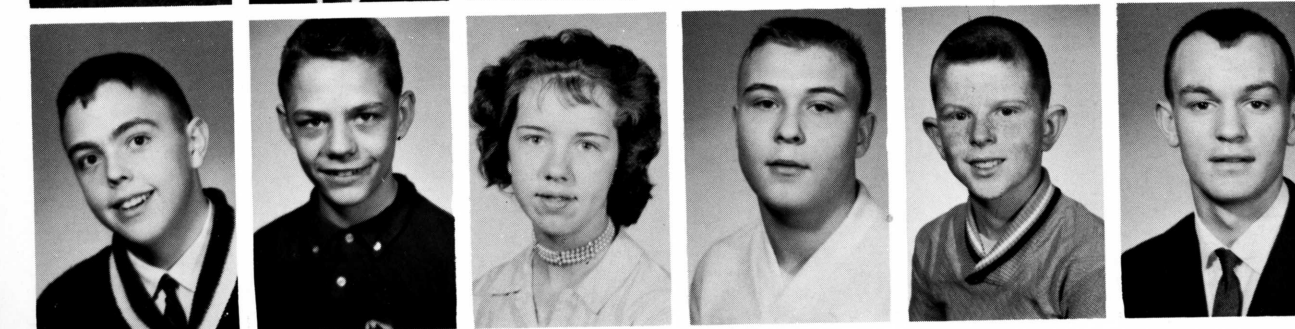
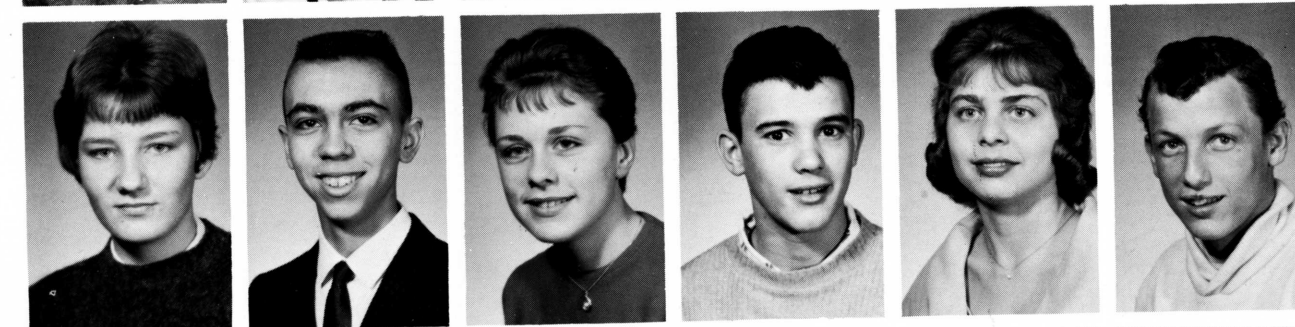
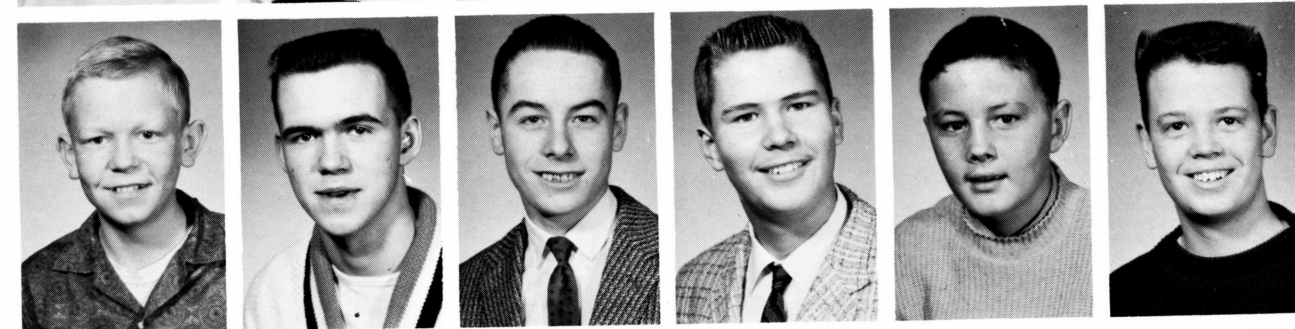
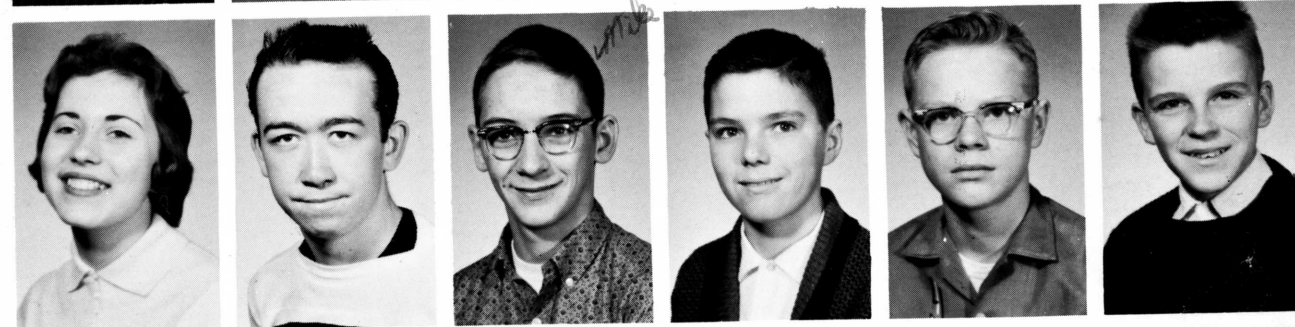
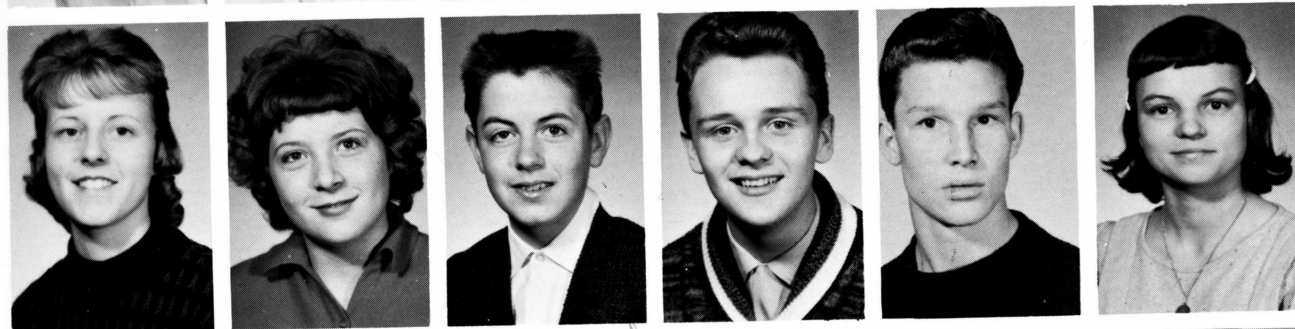
Courses are offered in Geography, Indiana and U.S. History, Problems of Democracy and World History.

The American Legion Essay Contest was under the direction of the Social Studies Department. The winner of the essay, "Communism, Our Active Enemy," was Robin Higham, a United States history student.

Social Studies classes were taught by Miss Stockinger, Mr. Frazier, Mr. Pasman, Mr. Wiles, Mr. Philip Morris, Mr. Neuman, Miss Rupley, Mr. Judd, Mr. Tague, Mr. Maxwell and Mrs. Culp, department chairman.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

The Spanish and Latin classes of the ninth grade have taken up their first foreign language study for high school credit. The ground work in both languages has involved learning vocabulary and translating sentences.

The five Latin classes have been taught by Miss Hodson. The work has included practice in pronun-

ciation, reading and writing Latin, learning about our Roman heritage, learning about English words derived from Latin, and the daily life of the Roman people. A chapter of the Junior Classical League was organized with a total membership of 95 students.

There have been five Spanish classes, four taught by Miss Pogue and one taught by Mrs. Williams. These classes have a good foundation in Spanish history as well as in writing and speaking Spanish words. They have begun to realize that a knowledge of this language is beneficial in our relationship with our Spanish-speaking neighbors of the Western hemisphere.

Early in May a merit scholarship examination was given in both Latin and Spanish with recognition for winners being made on Honor Day.

EXPLORATORY LANGUAGE

For the first time Exploratory Language has been offered as an elective course for eighth grade students who wanted some experience in the study of both Latin and Spanish before planning their ninth grade schedule.

For nine weeks, three days a week, either Spanish has been studied, with Miss Pogue as teacher, or Latin has been studied, with Miss Hodson as teacher. The second nine weeks these teachers traded classes so that the students spent an equal amount of time in the study of the two foreign languages.
