



## CLUBS AND ORGANIZATIONS

Chrysler High's chapter of N.F.L. began the year with 27 members and initiated 37 new members in May including 25 sophomores, 10 juniors, and 2 seniors. During the year, members earned 19 Degrees of Honor, 12 Degrees of Excellence, and 5 Degrees of Distinction, the highest membership level. As this was written, Beth Charlesworth was within five points of earning a Double Ruby Distinction or 500 points.
